We've joined staff professional development sessions, reviewed policies and seen the work done to upgrade the premises, allowing a more effective use of space and creating a fresh, bright look around the school. During our Curriculum Committee meeting in November Miss Cotchin and Mrs Fuller led us on a Learning Walk focusing on Extended Writing and Maths. Visiting the Year 2 and 6 classes we observed the teaching, looked at books and talked to the children about their learning. ### **Year 3 News**

Year 3 have had a great half term. They had the fantastic opportunity to go on, not one but two trips! They had an amazing time at Mead Open Farm where they saw lots of different animals and fed them. They also visited Waddesdon Manor where they took a tour of the house, which was inspired by childhood tales such as Alice in Wonderland and Peter Pan. The children also designed their very own bauble with Christmas designs. In Maths, Year 3 have been learning how to add and subtract amounts of money, find fractions of an amount and multiply and divide using the 4 and 8 times table. In English, we have been looking at using description in our writing by using adverbs, expanded noun phrases and adverbial phrases. Furthermore, Year 3 have enjoyed reading Greek myths in Reading and have been making predictions and inferences. In History, the children have been learning about the prehistoric period and how people lived in the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age.

They were also using resources to deepen their arithmetic skills. The Anglo Saxons and Vikings was our focus in History. We had our spectacular Viking Day where the children were enthralled by the amazing Viking expert. During DT, we learnt about 'Levers & Linkages' and the children put their knowledge to use by designing and creating a fabulous Christmas card with linkages. In Science, the children became experts on living things as they learnt about the features of vertebrates, invertebrates, flowering and non-flowering plants.

In English, Year 6 have continued reading The Clockwork Sparrow in SQUIRT, using this to inspire their writing for a number of different purposes. It has been amazing to see the children working particularly hard on their suspense writing. During our maths lessons, children have been focusing heavily on fractions, decimals and percentages. All the children have shown incredible resilience when tackling some tricky concepts which are brand new to them. One of the highlights of the half term was seeing the children's work in DT. The children have been practicing different stitches and showing great perseverance to eventually produce a purse or wallet from felt.
