Head Teacher News

Dear parents and families,

As the school year comes to a close, we should all feel extremely proud of all the successes we have had both individually and jointly as a school team. As we look back and reflect on this academic year, I am proud of the great learning attitudes our pupils have shown when doing their best and also of all the additional experiences they have had.

Our sense of community is proudly at the heart of our school and has helped us to overcome challenges we've encountered across the school year, with great examples and displays of support for each other being shown using our school values of inclusion, respect, responsibility, perseverance, honesty and collaboration.

It has been wonderful to see so many pupils and parents enjoy our school events, such as Come and Read, Open Classrooms and our Sports Days which proved an enormous success in their revised format. It was fantastic to look out on to the field when we held the recent family picnic and see so many families sharing time together in the glorious weather we were blessed with whilst enjoying the array of stalls on offer.

We have seen some great successes for our pupils and staff recently in terms of end of year data at key points across the school.

In KS1 SATS Year 2, we saw pupils achieving well in Reading and Maths with 70% of pupils working at the expected level.

In KS2 SATS Year 6, we saw pupils achieving well in Reading with 73% of pupils working at the expected level and a huge 37% working at greater depth. In maths 79% of pupils are working at the expected level and 29% working at greater depth. In Grammar, Spelling and Punctuation 76% of pupils are working at the expected level and a huge 37% working at greater depth. What does this mean for our pupils?

- For Reading, William Harding pupils do as well as all other pupils nationally
- For Maths, William Harding pupils do better than other pupils nationally
- For Grammar, Spelling and Punctuation, William Harding pupils do better than other pupils nationally
- For Reading, Writing and Maths together, William Harding pupils do as well as all other pupils nationally

However, we are all clear that it is also not just about the data; it is also about the personal pupil successes and the fact we ensure our pupils are as ready as possible for secondary school. Writing will be our School Development focus next year to ensure our results continue to improve further.

We have been so impressed with how the children have persevered to settle into their new classes and year groups with "Move Up, Stay Up". They have displayed both courage and resilience, safe in the knowledge that a helping hand is never far away from their staff in the classroom, the year group and from our fantastic SEN and FLO Teams.

We say goodbye to our Year 6 pupils as they move on to their new secondary schools in September. We wish them all the very best of luck, and we are confident that armed with their William Harding values and all that they have learnt, they will all do us proud as they embark on the next stage of their academic journey.

We must also say goodbye to some our staff members, who we thank for their hard work and commitment to William Harding. I am sure you will join me in thanking them and also extending a warm welcome to those new members of staff.

I hope you all have a wonderful break over the summer and enjoy spending time together and please do stay safe. We look forward to welcoming those returning to us in September, refreshed and ready to begin another school year. There is an inset for staff on Friday 1st and Monday 4th and therefore pupils return on Tuesday 5th September.
