Premises

It's been a very busy time for the Premises team with so much work taking place. Here's a brief run down;

- In KS1 we have a gorgeous new ceiling in the hall along with a brand new huge interactive whiteboard and sound system which will make assemblies and PE even better for our pupils.
- Both the year 1 and reception staff toilets have had a bit of a refurb and the skylights in Year 1 have been replaced. It is looking much nicer.
- The KS1 heating system has been completely overhauled with lots of pipe work replaced to resolve those heating issues from last year.
- Preschool drains have been sorted and the horrid smell has gone!
- The old art and practical room is now a larger space for the KS2 Booster room with a new IWB and brand new furniture. A much nicer teaching space for our pupils to use.
- The pathway along the front of the building and Year 4 classrooms has been resurfaced for safety and the pedestrian gate has been fixed. This is now much safer for our pupils.
- The main office has had a facelift which is a nicer environment for you and our office staff.
- We also have a brand new building! Next to the Year 6 block we now have an external pod that will become the changing rooms for the KS2 pupils a much nicer and brighter space.
- The current changing rooms are being converted in toilets with 5 or 6 cubicles providing better facilities for the pupils.
- The room at the back of Windsor has been renovated for accessibility and Windsor, Rowan and Hawthorn all have new lockers.
- We have planted lots of Spring bulbs ready to brighten everywhere up next year.
- The old kitchen is now an additional booster/intervention room.
- The Year 5 toilets are currently being refurbed completely so they will be a much nicer environment for our pupils.

It is lovely to see how we are improving the environment for our community.

Year 2 News

It's been a successful start for Year 2 and they've already shown they're great role models for the rest of KS1. The children have got stuck into their learning and developed their knowledge of words and phrases they can use in their writing, including expanded noun phrases and both coordinating and subordinating conjunctions. We've seen some great writing from them and can't wait to see more!

During our Maths lessons, we have been focusing on the column methods of addition and subtraction and the children are getting to grips with how to use these to solve different problems.

We've been busy in our afternoon lessons learning about the different systems in our body in Science, kindness in Christianity in RE and how to use different shapes, tints and shades in Art. Here are some of our creations using primary and secondary colours. Year 2 ended the term by winning their gem reward – well done!

Year 3 News

Year 3 have had a good start to the term. They have been learning place value and addition and subtraction up to 3 digits in maths. They have been using concrete resources to work out calculations that require bridging and exchanging. In English, we have been looking at using conjunctions, speech and points of view in our writing. In Science, the children have been learning about the different types of body systems such as the nervous system, the digestive system and the muscular system and why these are important. In Geography, we have been looking at Aylesbury and Cartagena and finding similarities and difference between them. In Reading, the children have enjoyed reading Charlotte's Webb and answering inference and retrieval questions. The children have enjoyed learning about the artist Katsushika Hokusai who used lines and block printing to create art. The children then had a go at creating their own art piece using printing.

Year 4 News

It's been a fantastic start to the school year in Year 4. This term, in English, our lessons have been based on the novel 'Bill's New Frock' and the picture book 'Voices in the Park'. The children have produced fantastic work including diary entries in character, formal persuasive letters and newspaper reports.

In maths, the children have been developing their knowledge on place value, addition and subtraction. We have also been practicing our arithmetic skills and learning our times tables. 'The Digestive System' has been our focus in Science this term. The children were excited to learn about where their food goes and how they can eat more healthily to gain essential nutrients.

In Geography, we have been studying maps and looking carefully at how Aylesbury has changed over the last 100 years. During Art lessons, the children have experimented with charcoal and practiced different techniques within shading.



Year 6 News

This half term, the year 6's started off with their focus entirely on the 11+. Well done to all children during this tough week. Throughout the half term, the children have been working on their maths skills, looking at the four operations, fractions, and place value. In English, the children have started their first SQUIRT text of the year, 'The Clockwork Sparrow', and the children have thoroughly enjoyed the start of the book.

In our afternoon sessions, the children have been learning about the Earth and its geography, focusing on time zones and lines of latitude and longitude. In PE, the children have been creating their own gymnastics routines in indoor PE and practicing their football skills in outdoor PE. Last week, the children completed their first assessment week of the year and all the staff were incredibly impressed with their focus and hard work during the week.

This week, a total of 84 children joined us at River Dart for an exciting week full of team building activities

and the children have had a great time! The children in school have spent the week completing investigations, baking, topic afternoons and craft and drama activities.
