Pre-school News


This half term has flown by so quickly, we have been amazed by how well all our children have settled in. We have enjoyed getting to know them and see friendships blossom.

During Computing we have looked at the difference in hardware and software. While doing this we created our own computers out of paper with all the different parts to it.

Teachers make us do great and interesting work. We get to learn new things every day.

Year 4 News

This term, Year 4 have been busy bees. We have focused on 'Bill's New Frock' and 'Voices in the Park' and 'Window' as our novel studies in English.

We have looked at the different features within different genres of writing, for example character descriptions and persuasive letters. Within these we have been including a range of conjunctions, including subordinate clauses, different sentence types and even adverbials.

In Maths we began consolidating place value then we looked at problems using addition and subtraction up to four-digit numbers using formal column methods with exchanging and carrying.



In science, we learnt about the process of digestion through a demonstration showing what happens to food after it enters our mouth. We loved seeing how the food changed throughout. "This was one of my favourite lessons I have ever done!" Skye

In geography, we focused on spatial sense including identify lines of latitude and longitude.

We have made an amazing start to the year and had lots of fun!

Year 5 News

Year 5 have had a successful start to the year - we've all been so impressed with the way they have settled back into life at William Harding, even if it is a little stranger.

The children have got stuck into their learning and have particularly enjoyed reading Michael Morpurgo's 'The Butterfly Lion' and 'Cloud Tea Monkeys' during their SQUIRT sessions and have produced some wonderful work inspired by these stories.

During our Maths lessons, the children have secured their knowledge of place value and have been working hard to develop their written and mental addition and subtraction strategies.

'While learning about modernist art, we learnt that abstract art can be simple or detailed. This style of art is unique and it doesn't have to look like anything in particular. When we created our own designs, we loved using our imagination as well taking inspiration from other people'.



Year 6 news

Year 6 have had an excellent first half term back. The children have settled in superbly and it seems as if they haven't had a single moment off from school.

This half term we have been reading 'The Clockwork Sparrow' by Catherine Woodfine and have focused many of our English lessons around our focused text.

In Maths, we have focused on place value, multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 and fractions. We have looked at our spatial sense topic for Geography, Victorian art and architecture for Art and the Human body for science.

Our last two weeks have involved assessment week which children have worked hard in and theme week too where we have explored different topics.

We have also announced our house and vice house captains which all Year 6's found incredibly exciting.


HARVEST
