

In English, we have been reading lots of space themed books and have been writing sentences about the planets and space aliens. In Maths, we have been thinking about finding more/less, addition, subtraction and number bonds to 5.

We have also learnt about forces, freezing and melting and how to keep our bodies healthy. The children are excited to continue their learning next half term through our topic of 'The Wild West'!

We have learned about statistics and measurements in Maths, read some incredible Roald Dahl books including 'The Enormous Crocodile', 'The magic Finger' and 'The Twits' and written some amazing character descriptions and past and present tense narratives.

In Science, we learned about electricity by building circuits and experimenting with materials to see if they were insulators or conductors.

In Art, we drew and painted self-portraits, using famous works to inspires us. Finally, in Geography, we explored the British Isles and learned about special landmarks.

During Art we have looked at 2 different artists, Turner and Constable, and have created our own seascapes. We created a boat in a stormy looking at different brush strokes. Here is an example of fantastic work below:

In Geography, we have looked at Africa, learning all about different human and physical features, the climate and different languages. Yea 3 have loved learning about a different culture, some children are now keen to visit Africa!

Year 4 News

In English, we have been reading 'Journey to the River Sea' and have used it to inspire our writing across a range of genres including narratives from different character's perspectives about: boats crashing and people getting lost; diaries about meeting new people and writing letters home. We also wrote a non-chronological report about whales and found some interesting facts.

In Maths, we are continuing to apply our recall skills to multiplication and division facts up to 12. This term, we have also worked on improper and mixed number fractions. In addition, we had a great day raising money for charity on the NSPCC number day, when we enjoyed learning how to complete sudoku and other logic problem games. In Science, we learnt about food chains and created our own which included a source of energy, a producer, a consumer, a predator and a decomposer. In Geography, we have been studying settlements and looking at the facilities and services that Aylesbury have and comparing the size of Aylesbury to surrounding hamlets, villages, towns and cities. In Art, we have been learning how to create a composition working at foreground, middle ground and background.

Dear parents and families,

For us as a school the Spring 1st half term was the most challenging. This was again due to COVID with high numbers of COVID cases within our school – both with pupils and staff. Running a school in normal times is always a logistical challenge however running with 32 staff off and 181 pupils off was a new challenge! I would like to personally thank our entire school community for all working together to keep the school and classes open. Thank you also for you support and understanding. I hope that as we now begin to 'live with COVID' we can enjoy some normality again.

As we come out of our COVID high absence, I am delighted to say that attendance rates are improving so thank you to parents/carers and everyone involved helping to encourage pupils to be in school. Our FLO team (Family Liaison Officers) who lead on attendance are so focused and have such an impact which benefits the education of the pupils. Our attendance is now back in the 90%.

Our Business Support Manager, Miss Judge has been working closely with Transport for Bucks about the pathway outside the front of the school. As you can see they have repaved it – Miss Judge has been in touch to ensure that these are completed to a safe standard. Miss Wood has recently joined William Harding as our new School Counsellor.
