- Be open and welcoming and offer opportunities for parents to be involved
- Communicate clearly and regularly with parents and families
- Ensure that all pupils are made aware that unacceptable behaviour is not tolerated
- Report on children's progress each term

## Pupils will;

- Come to school regularly and on time
- Treat others with consideration and respect
- Listen carefully to what others have to say
- Follow instructions from all school staff
- Wear school uniform and be tidy
- Read daily
- Look after the school and property
- Be kind, helpful and polite to everyone
- Ensure school staff are not contacted through digital media
- Ensure nothing is posted on the internet that may hurt the feelings of other people or cause distress
- Ensure that personal information is not shared with others

## Parents will aim to:

- Ensure their child attends, notifying the school as soon as possible of any absences and provide an explanation
- Support the school's policies and procedures including attending parents' evenings and information events
- Support their child with daily reading
- Respect all members of the school community, abiding by a policy of zero tolerance towards rude and aggressive behaviour, behaving in an appropriate way so that the school is not brought into disrepute
- Direct any complaints or concerns through the school's official channels and not use private groups, or social media to complain about or criticise the school or members of staff. This is not constructive and the school can't improve or address issues if they aren't raised in an appropriate way
- Ensure mobile phones and smart watches are not used on site
- Communicate with the school regarding any about concerns or health that may affect their child's behaviour and ensure phone numbers and contact details are up to date
