Democracy


We vote for who represents us on the School Council.

everyone has rigȟts and responsibilities


We know that How can we you show **2** this?

British Values examples of Democracy

Democracy is shown in;

- Discussing things with our friends
- The way we vote for things in our class
- Voted pupils on the School Council or House representatives
- Which charities we choose
- ► The Government as people vote for them

British Values examples of Rule of Law

Rule of Law is shown in;

- Our behaviour policy
- School rules
- Laws that protect us such as speeding rules
- The Governments rules such as social distancing

British Values examples of Individual liberty

Individual liberty is shown in;

- All the choices we decide make
- Choices in who are our friends
- Choices in what we do each day
- Choices about which clubs we go to or the books we read
- Our rights as people of England

British Values examples of Respect

Respect is shown in;

- How we treat ourselves
- How we treat others
- How we treat property and belongings such as our pencil cases
- How we work together and give everyone a chance
- How we help each other

British Values examples of Tolerance

Tolerance is shown in;

- How we enjoy learning about religions in RE
- How we understand about other cultures and what it is like in other peoples homes
- How we may have different ideas but that is ok
- How lots of different types of people are still our friends
