
Safer Internet Day

The children's task is to create digital content based on one of the key themes of online safety. At a time when young people are using the internet more than ever, we want them to take the lead and create digital content with a positive message and that they create something which could help educate other young people.



There are four categories for entries:

Reception

What should the troll do? Drawing and voice recording activity based on the book Troll Stinks.

Key stage 1

The children will create an animation based on Online Bullying. What could someone do if they, through no fault of their own, fell victim to an online bully?

Lower Key stage 2

The children will create a digitally illustrated story or poem based on Digital Wellbeing. How would we help someone to understand about living a balanced digital life?

Upper key stage 2

The children will create a digital book based on Fake News/ False Information. What can you do to find out whether something online is true or not? The children will be encouraged to show off their digital skills by using a range of apps and media to complement their digital project.
