Purpose of job:

- To provide specialist skills and knowledge, at an advanced level, in a specialist area (e.g. EAL, Behaviour, SEN)
- To plan, resource, deliver and monitor progress for pupils programmes within the classroom or as part of a separate strategy

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Teaching and learning

Under the direction of the class teacher, Lead TA, SEN team and Extended Leadership Team Use specialist experience, knowledge and skills to;

- To support pupils with challenging or high level needs, including those with special educational needs, disabilities, EAL or behaviour, learn as effectively and independently as possible through; modelling to pupils, using effective resources, supporting with vocabulary, using questioning, discussion
- Create a positive working relationship and environment that supports pupils needs so they can
 access the learning, leading on the pupils educational, social, emotional and personal
 development
- Modify the class teacher's planned activities to meet the needs of pupils
- To plan, deliver and evaluate interventions and additional teaching to pupils
- To understand and follow support plans and EHCPs, drawing on own knowledge and experience
- Observe pupil performance and give feedback towards external professional meetings
- Provide positive and supportive feedback to pupils and parents (where necessary)
- Have high expectations, promote self-esteem and independence
- Support pupil's behaviour in line with the school's vision, values and positive behaviour policy using Wellbeing Plans and bespoke strategies where needed
- Promote good behaviour, dealing promptly with conflicts and incidents in line with policy, and encourage children to take responsibility for their own behaviour
- Be a role model for pupils
- Model and support other teaching assistants to support pupils
- To support and uphold the school's vision, values and motto
- To support with educational visits, taking responsibility for the welfare and learning of pupils with additional needs

Health and safety and Safeguarding

- Ensure the safety, wellbeing and safeguarding of pupils with needs by following schools' policies or pupils plans or EHCPs
- Be creative with how pupils with needs are supported when they are upset or have had issues



Other

- To undertake gate, break and lunch duties promoting a safe and positive experience
- To work as members of the school staff team in the smooth running of the school
