
## **Pre-School News**

## **Year 1 News**



In writing, children focused on understanding and identifying prefixes and suffixes, using a wide range of punctuation and understanding the components of a story. Throughout our Art lessons we have been investigating the work of artists such as Joan Miro and Paul Klee and creating our own masterpieces in their style. Enjoy a well deserved break!

In Maths, we are continuing to apply our recall skills to multiplication and division facts up to 12. This term, we have also worked on equivalent fractions and how to simplify them. In addition, we had a great day raising money for charity on the NSPCC number day, when we enjoyed learning how to complete sudoku and played Mathopoly. In Science, we learnt about food chains and created our own. In Geography, we have been studying settlements and looking at the facilities and services that Aylesbury has and comparing the size of Aylesbury to surrounding hamlets, villages, towns and cities. In Art, we have been learning how to create a composition working at foreground, middle ground and background. Finally, we were lucky enough to visit Waterside Theatre to watch Demon Dentist.

Year 6 have had a fun packed term this Spring. We have just completed our Assessment Week where the children again worked really hard and all teachers were really impressed by their hard work.


As usual, the children have been working hard in their daily Maths and English lessons and we have started to read 'Goodnight Mister Tom' in SQUIRT (Super Quality Uninterrupted Independent Reading Time).

We have had some fun in our foundation subjects.

We explored electricity in our Science lessons and our final experiment was to test different materials to see which one conducted electricity the best. In Art, we looked at art in the Italian Renaissance where children got to pretend to be Michelangelo painting on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel.

During Geography, we learnt about North and South America. We looked at why the Mississippi River was so important for trade and how the Amazon rainforest was being destroyed by deforestation due to demand for timber but also for farming. We put our spreadsheet knowledge to good use in computing by planning food and drinks for an end of term party. Children had to research prices online and use formulas in Excel to work out total price for the items they wanted. Some children showed great responsibility by trying to keep their prices as low as possible!
