

Waddesdon Manor is a country house in the village of Waddesdon, Buckinghamshire, England. It is a listed house that was built in the Neo-Renaissance style of a French Chateau for Baron Ferdinand de Rothschild. The manor now belongs to the National Trust and is one of its most visited properties.



Hartwell House is a country house in the parish of Hartwell, Buckinghamshire, England. The house is owned by the Ernest Cook Trust and has been a Historic House Hotel since 1989. The listed building is Jacobean with a Goegrian front and Rococo interiors. It is most famous for being the home of French king Louis XV111.



Claydon House is a country house in the Aylesbury Vale, Buckinghamshire, England near the village of Middle Claydon. It was built between 1757 and 1771 and is owned by the National Trust. The house is a listed building. The house has been the home of the Verney family since 1620.
