Re: Year 6 SATs week reminder

On **Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> May**, SATs week will begin and our Year 6 pupils will sit a range of tests starting over the **Tuesday**, **Wednesday**, **Thursday** and **Friday**. The children have put in lots of hard work over the past year and next week the children will be sitting the papers to showcase this effort. These tests are a statutory part of the curriculum and they will assess the children's understanding in Maths, SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) and Reading in readiness for their Secondary school.

To help with preparing your children at home, please find the attached top tips for dealing with SATs document, that highlights how your child/children can prepare themselves for the papers that are coming up next week. There are also some reminders within the document as to what the expectations are for next week during the papers.

## Attendance

Attendance across the week is incredibly important, and your child needs to be in school at the normal time, to ensure they are in school ready for the start of the tests. If your child misses the Friday test they may not get a maths score if they cannot resit the following week. If your child is unwell then please do not send your child in, and we will catch up the test at a future date. We want to ensure that all of our pupils have the best opportunity to succeed in these important tests as they have worked so hard!
